MINERAL GROUP MEETING

Ten members attended. Reports from Aaron; his purchases on the open day, Ann; on their ten day tour of Iceland, Roland; on his visit to the Victoria museum, book on the elements from Corrimal newsagency and the top geoshot 2015, rock stars photo competition and Peter; on his visit to Agate Creek. The minerals identified were: quartz, copper, stellerite and calcite. Noel advised the mineral display and photographic entries are now due at the September meeting on 23rd. There is a workshop for these competitions on 2nd September at 7pm, club rooms. Noel presented a power point presentation on composition -- the chemistry of minerals. Noel spoke about the beginning of the universe and what we know about the Earth. Rocks contain minerals and these minerals are comprised of atoms. All minerals have an atomic number which represents the number of protons in the nucleus of an atom of a given element. An atom is the smallest unitary constituent of an element, composed of a more or less complex aggregate of protons, neutrons and electrons, whose number and arrangement determine the element. Nothing is pure and minerals contain impurities. To be able to read and understand the chemical composition of minerals more aptly, you need to know at least forty four of the ninety two elements in the periodic table.
