#### Mineral Group Meeting 20 July, 2017.

Sixteen members braved a cold night. Don & Coral did a presentation on "names of Minerals". Started by the IMA in 1958 & formalizing a name commission in 1960. Naming came from the chemistry, crystallography, geological setting, where found & proposed name. A lot of the naming came from latin/greek names. There are today some 5250 named minerals. Petri & Glen presented three DVD/videos on the Bathurst Museum, which has a fossil & mineral display. Well worthwhile a visit. Noel did a power point presentation on the "azurite suns" from the Northern Territory. The new mineral of the month, presented by Noel, is atacamite- mostly dark green, Cu2CI(OH)3-orthorhombic system. The freeby, supplied by Noel, is titanite, from Harts Range, NT.

Finally the ID this month-- 12 minerals identified from photos of each mineral, which were faceted, two photos of each mineral. The average score from the group was 6/12. The minerals identified were: diamond, beryl var. emerald, corundum var. sapphire, corundum var. ruby, elbaite, topaz, garnet, quartz, sphalerite, fluorite, calcite & gypsum. A fun night was had by all.
