# **Social Meeting**

# Mineral Group Meeting

Sixteen members attended and reports given by Noel and Carol. Don Anderson took this meeting and kept members thinking throughout the night. The ID exercise of eight minerals was reasonably handled by members with a couple a little more difficult. The minerals were: natrolite x2, heulandite, stellerite, sphalerite/galena, chalcopyrite, atacamite and wolframite. Don spoke about the difference between anatase and natrolite with habit and colour distinguishing features. Don then explained how difficult it is to distinguish between schorl and dravite. Colour and chemical composition are good indications. Most of the specimens found in Australia are schorl. Don finished his presentation with a talk about the minerals found around Harts Range and how with heating of quartz, a specimen, at a temperature from a 573 degrees C ,changes to tridymite, cristobalite and others.
