Morthology - which is a term used to describe the form or shape in which individual crystals or aggregates of crystals occur. Several terms are used to indicate how well a crystal has formed - euhedral - well formed & bound only by flat crystal faces - anhedral - irregular shape with no crystal faces, subhedral - partially well formed, partially irregular & - xenomorphic - deformed, usually by growing within a confined space. 2. Due to the mis-use of saws, especially the trim saw, it has now been decided by the executive that if you wish to use any of the saws in the cutting room, please contact your Supervisor for advice on the size and thickness of the stone in question before using any of the saws. This is due to the fact that the trim saw is being used on stone/rocks that it is not meant to cut. Remember, this is only a trim saw and it should be used to trim stones only.

Bob Strachan has secured the guards on the 8" saw so that only the correct sized stone can be cut on this saw. Note also that the new saw will only allow the correct pressure to be placed on the blade. Press to hard and it just moves back.
