Mineral Group Meeting 28th Feb. 2018.

- 1. Sixteen members attended & reports given. The mineral of the month is apophyllite which refers to three minerals: fluorapophyllite, hydroxapophyllite & fluoraphyllite-- wide range of colours.
- 2. email ID was Sulphur.

Two presentations as follows:

Ann Kennon-alpine minerals-found in the Swiss Alps & similar regions- size from small to large. Approximately 50 minerals found & the ones covered by Ann were: quartz, tourmaline & fluorite. The people who fossicked for these minerals were called "strahlers" & the art known as strahling. Ann spoke about quartz gwindels with hematite- "iron roses" & alpine pink fluorite.

Keith Tysson- cleavage of minerals- Keith discussed the different types of cleavage & displayed photos of fluorite, galena, calcite & halite showing the cleavage present. Of course Keith had to display a different type of cleavage, if you know what I mean.

The ID, conducted by Noel, this week, the members identified 10 minerals from their composition (with 2 ring ins to make it a bit harder) & the minerals were: corundum, graphite, periclase (not a mineral), vanadinite, rhodocrosite, smithsonite, dioptase, magnesite, scheelite & cerussite. Most of the members got about 50% correct, however, Adrian topped the marks with 80% correct. The freeby of the month is gypsum.
