The DVD tonight was from the Dallas Symposium 2017 with the speaker Eugene Marini. His subject was "cleaning, repairing & restoring mineral specimens". He showed how ordinary specimens looked after their work in the laboratory.

He also displayed "trimmed" specimens & how well they look after being in the laboratory. This makes very good specimens for museum/private collections.

The ID No.4 via email was proustite ..(a very red & shiny mineral). The mineral of the month is franklinite (black mineral). The main ten minerals identified fairly well (average 6/10, Adrian 9/10) were: azurite, bornite, chalcantite, chalcopryite, cuprite, malachite x2, chrysocolla, turquoise & copper. You will note all ten are copper minerals.

The freeby of the month is muscovite from Harts Range N. T.

Next meeting is, as usual , on the last Wednesday of May. next Wednesday night 6.30PM - two presentations by Aaron & John & Adrian—native metals + usual ID exercise etc.

Entering a competition for the very first time can be daunting experience however, this is where your Committee together with your workshop supervisor/teacher/tutor can provide the necessary support, advice and encouragement to help your members achieve the next step with their craft.

Improved Skills:

When you compete, your work is critiqued by an impartial judge, who does not even know who has done the work; your entry to them is a number only, so to start with there is no bias of any sort.

The Judge's comments will be encouraging, but also where due, will have constructive criticism which points out areas where you may improve your performance/skills. This also provides you with the finer points of what makes a piece of work look good to everyone-not just a judge-and appears as a quality piece of something you have made yourself.

Rewarding:

If the judge gives you a good mark (not necessarily win a prize) it will make you feel that your efforts have achieved something with your craft, but it is also a reward for your teacher/tutor that their knowledge has been passed on to you.

It is also a way of promoting the reputation of your Club. While it shows that your members are a keen, inspired/enthusiastic group, it also helps maintain excellent reputation your Club has at both State and National level.

In any competition, there are various levels of achievements and skill sets to enter, so you do not necessarily have to compete against the "best of the best"

So be proud of what YOU have done regardless of your perception of your skill level and enter.
