Our first outing found us at Valentine's Mine, where a couple of loupe requiring, dots of gold on quartz were found, better than nothing...right? (10 points to the person who spots it in the photo below)





After that, we ventured off to see a bit more history at the Hill

End Quartz Roasting Pits. These pits were designed to roast and crush gold-bearing ore, unfortunately it wasn't as profitable as they thought it would be. It was closed after barely a year and the machinery was sold.
