Social Meeting August 17 Dinosaurs by Joan Zealey.

A multitude of sensational photos of South and North American fossils especially of the Jurassic period – Dinosaurs, Icthyosaurs and the ancestors of Hoop and Bunya pines. It was surprising the similarity that was demonstrated between these and those being uncovered in North Queensland. Thank you Joan.

Agate Creek Field Trip

Three members travelled to Agate Creek in North Queensland on a club field trip led by Allan House.

They left for Agate Creek on 12 May travelling by the inland route to Mt Surprise and spent a couple of days at the O'Briens Creek fossicking area where they scraped and dug for topaz bringing back more than 500 carats, the largest being 155 carats. A good effort.

On arrival at Agate Creek camping ground, there were far more campers there than expected and soon found most had come up after the Gemboree at Rockhampton. They had specked in Agate and Spring creeks. Having checked both with low success, they concentrated on the tributaries and the escarpment and was rewarded with many fine pieces. The largest agate measures 22cm x 15cm x 10cm with several others measuring over 15cm. They dug for thundereggs at two previous locations and for the first time at Black Soil where pancake thundereggs are common. Allan brought back a double pancake 36cm x 24cm and altogether more than 100 others from that spot alone.
