Now to the questions posed by Roly.

1 How many minerals are composed of a single element? His answer was 42 as shown in the attachment ELEMENT, but 7 are not listed in Fleischer. So the best answer is 35.

2 Which mineral consists of most elements? Roly and Ed were the only two to send answers. Both said that that mineral was **byzantievite** which has 11 elements plus the rare earth elements as also shown in the attachment.

My answers to the two questions differ from those of Roly and Ed – see the attachment.

1 No minerals have one element as they are all impure

2 And all minerals contain 92 elements for the same reason. Note that some elements will be present in exceedingly small amounts but all of them will be there.
